US-Afghan Women's Council Meeting with Secretary Clinton

I recently had the pleasure of meeting with Secretary Clinton, Mrs. Laura Bush, Ambassador Verveer, Ambassador Richard Holbrooke,

and members of the US-Afghan Women's Council in Washington, D.C. for a formal presentation of the Council's projects.

The meeting began with welcomes from Ambassador Melanne Verveer, Ambassador-at-Large for Global Women's Issues, and Secretary Hillary Clinton. Honorary Advisor Mrs. Laura W. Bush joined the group via teleconference and offered her greetings and comments. The new Afghan Charge de Affairs, Khojesta Fana Ebrahimkhel, brought greetings from the Afghan Minister of Foreign Affairs.

Secretary Clinton delivered remarks outlining her goals for Afghanistan and her desire to continue to empower women. The Council's key members offered Secretary Clinton a summary of Council projects and activities. The group entered into a lively dialogue and exchange of ideas on future collaboration with Ambassador Richard Holbrooke, Special Representative for Afghanistan and Pakistan.

I was simply honored to be at the table to discuss Secretary Clinton's and Ambassador Holbrooke's vision for Afghan women. The discussion centered on their commitment to continue to empower women with additional education programs and entrepreneurial skills. They also thoroughly discussed reintegration and reconciliation plans and assured us that the clock will not be turned back on Afghan women.

Secretary Clinton acknowledged the work of the Institute's PEACE THROUGH BUSINESS program and encouraged us to continue our efforts and reach further into the rural areas of the country. Mrs. Bush also expressed her concern about talks with the Taliban, and she thanked the Institute and asked us to continue to empower women to go further in their studies.
